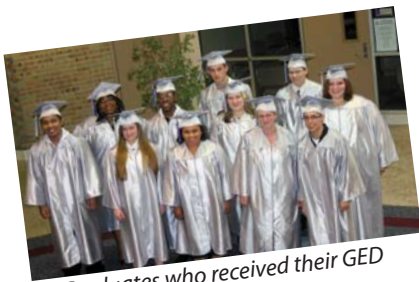
Special Olympics, "Coach of the Year"

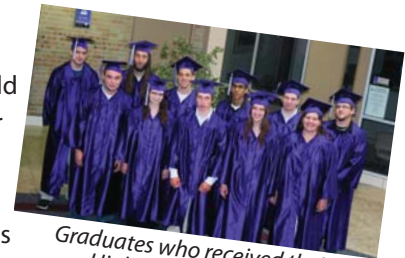
make volleyball fun as well as competitive. Mary-Eileen is always recruiting students to join Special Olympics and is a very good mentor to our athletes.
