EMERGENCY SECLUSION & RESTRAINT KEY PERSONNEL TRAINING

Non-Violent Crisis Intervention (CPI) Full Course

Nonviolent Crisis Intervention FULL training is perfect for primary caregivers, educators and human service professionals who directly intervene in crisis situations. This training teaches staff de-escalation techniques as well as restrictive and nonrestrictive interventions. This training is required for all school-based key personnel under the "Emergency Seclusion and Restraint" Law. This is intended for staff who have not received CPI training before, and/or staff who have an expired certificate.

K-12 Behavioral Threat Assessment & Management BTAM Basic Training

Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management (BTAM) is a fact-based, systematic process designed to identify, assess, and manage potentially dangerous or violent situations. Over 20+ years of research by the Secret Service supports that BTAM is very effective in identifying and mitigating behaviors of concern by helping to engage additional interventions and supports. The school Behavioral Threat Assessment & Management (BTAM) training is based upon research and best practices developed by the U.S. Secret Service.

BASIC TRAINING

The basic training teaches threat assessment teams how to effectively conduct a threat assessment according to best practices outlined by the United States Secret Service National Threat Assessment Center (NTAC). The goal of BTAM is to identify, engage, and work collaboratively with students and families to mitigate life situational factors contributing to thoughts of violence and aggression.

The one-day basic training workshop covers the following topics:

- Understanding school violence and implications for prevention
- What is BTAM, and what it's not.
- 8 steps in developing and operating an effective school threat assessment program
- Critical steps to conducting a thorough threat assessment process
- Tabletop Exercise screening, inquiry/investigation/assessing and analyzing
- Developing and implementing case management plans
- Tabletop Exercise identifying resources and creating the management plan
- Summary / Q & A

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

At the end of the course, participants will:

- Understand major facts about school violence and how prevention is possible.
- Be familiar with the principles of behavioral threat assessment and why schools should use it.
- Know how to build a threat assessment program using the 8 Steps
- · Gain practice using threat assessment procedures through multiple tabletop exercises
- Understand how to work a threat assessment case
- · How to screen cases to see if a threat assessment is warranted
- · How to gather information from multiple sources
- How to analyze the information using 11-Key Questions
- · How to make an assessment
- · How to develop a case management plan to reduce risk

We highly recommend that school/district BTAM teams attend the training together. Critical team members include administrators (principals/assistant principals/deans), school psychologists, counselors, social workers, school resource officers, and law enforcement. Other important professionals can also include behavioral interventionists, special education professionals/case managers, nurses, and community mental health professionals providing services in the schools and/or those who may help work threat assessment cases.

Introduction to Restorative PRACTICES







When students are healthy, safe, supported, engaged, and challenged, they are able to learn to the best of their ability
- Setting up/Evaluating your Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) System: Customize professional learning for your team on PBIS and the components that make it successful. We can support you in the review of current practices or starting the work in your school or district. Components include: Developing a behavior matrix/school-wide expectations Behavior referral form Behavior flow chart Lesson plans for teaching expectations Lesson plan schedule School-wide recognition system Behavior data collection and review Tiered interventions
- **Classroom-wide PBIS Strategies:** Build a foundational understanding of strategies that will help staff build positive relationships and systems of management within school settings. Each session may focus on 2-3 different strategies, depending on time and need.

Through SWIS, (School-Wide Information System), school staff enters office discipline referrals online. We can provide Swift at SWIS training to introduce school-wide or individual staff to the purpose, features, benefits, and procedures related to implementing SWIS and build fluency using the SWIS application.
- Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs): ACEs harm children's developing brains and lead to changing how they respond to stress and damaging their immune systems so profoundly that the effects show up decades later. ACEs cause much of our burden of chronic disease, most mental illness, and are at the root of most violence. Working together, we can help create schools, neighborhoods, communities, and a world in which every child can thrive. Contact us to plan a session to support your district or school.
- **Mental Health Screening Implementation:** Screening is crucial to identifying students who are at-risk due to their social-emotional needs. Just as students are screened for physical health issues during school physicals, they should also be screened for any behavioral/mental health "red flags." Screening data provides the means to deliver proper support to students in need.
- **Restorative Practices:** We can customize professional learning for your staff or school leadership team on Restorative Practices. Restorative practices are processes that emphasize the importance of establishing routines and expectations for positive student behavior and using approaches that strengthen relationships, create a respectful environment, and proactively build a community to prevent problems from arising. When problems do occur, the restorative practices approach helps to restore relationships and repair the harm caused to the school community. HEALTH DATA UTILIZATION

Our service assists in identifying health data tools that schools can use to identify their strengths and weaknesses in health-related areas. Furthermore, our Regional School Health Coordinator can help with data interpretation and provide recommendations.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

My goal is to assist you in customizing your health programs, services, policies, and procedures to suit your specific requirements. I can provide step-by-step guidance on developing pacing guides, implementation plans, and other essential support. Additionally, I offer coaching to health education teachers and schools using the Michigan Model for Health curriculum for grades PK-12. For schools that offer sex education, I can provide coaching on the Michigan Model for Health, Michigan 3 R's curriculum, and compliance requirements from the Sex Education Advisory Board. Each school can also access implementation planning services for all programs and services the Regional School Health Coordinator provides.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Local districts in the area are trained on the Michigan Model for Health curriculum, which is suitable for both PreK and K-12 students. The Regional School Health Coordinator is a designated trainer for HIV-required education. Furthermore, districts that opt to provide sex education can receive training on best practices from the Michigan Model and Michigan 3 R's teachers. Additionally, supplemental training for each module of the Michigan Model deals with topics such as Social and Emotional Health, Nutrition and Physical Activity, Safety, Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drugs, and Personal Health and Wellness. Professional learning opportunities are also available for other health-related areas, including Adverse Childhood Experiences, Alcohol and Other Drug-Related Stash Products, and Narcan. Health and P.E. Network Meetings are scheduled one-two times a year, where ideas and information and planning can occur.

• MATERIALS

To access the Michigan Model for Health, contact the Regional School Health Coordinator, who can provide a two-year digital license, kit materials including books for lower elementary, and additional videos not included in the digital curriculum. Extra health-related materials can be purchased based on available grant funds if needed. Districts can also order hard copy binders of any Michigan Model for Health Curriculums at no cost, depending on available grant funds.

HIV & SEX ED ADVISORY BOARD

The Regional School Health Coordinator can assist with various requirements related to the Sex Education Advisory Board, such as implementation, the two-year report, training for Sex Education Supervisors, providing templates and tools for meetings, and parent surveys. Additionally, a guided review of the Michigan Model for Health lessons can determine whether abstinence-only or abstinence-based is most prudent and provides coaching.

This training is designed for teachers, paraprofessionals and itinerants to review the basics of the LAMP Words for Life software and other AAC software systems, approach, basic implementation strategies and tools/resources to incorporate the use of the device into the classroom setting.
